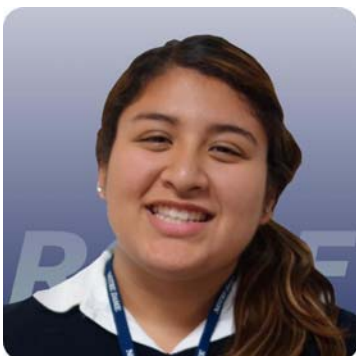




2015 Scholarship Recipients (12 Awarded - \$4000 each)

After graduating, David plans on attending Stanford University.



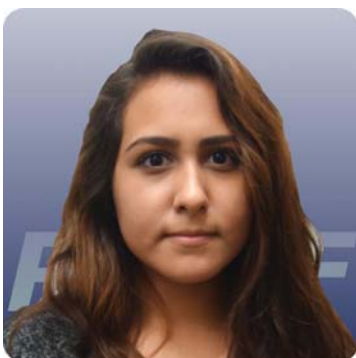

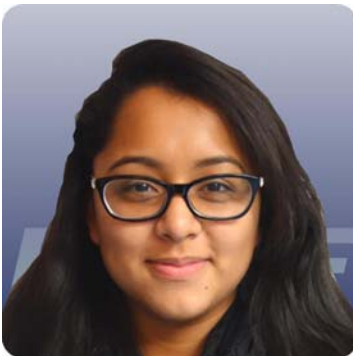
Leila Ramirez
